ABORTIONIST PLANS TO OPEN BIRTH CONTROL BUSINESS IN SUGARCREEK TOWNSHIP

Sugarcreek Township officials confirm that a new “business” is opening in Sugarcreek Township, called “Abby’s Place for Women” at 6064 Wilmington Pike in the Sugarcreek Plaza. According to their website, <https://www.abbysplaceforwomen.com/> they will offer birth control prescriptions on site with no physical exam.

Unfortunately, there is more to story. Dayton Right to Life has also learned that the person behind this new business model, is Dr. Timothy Kress. He is a documented abortionist with a long and problematic history. His medical license was revoked in 1999 due to felony drug charges to which he pled guilty. His license was then re-instated in 2001. As of October 2016, he was employed at the Planned Parenthood location in Bedford Heights, Ohio. While there he has, according to documented State Medical Board reports, at least 15 incidents of incomplete chemical abortions requiring follow-up medical aspirations (abortion). “Dayton Right to Life is extremely troubled about this business in our community that may have such a negative impact on true women’s health,” Says Paul Coudron, Executive Director, Dayton Right to Life. “Our question would be, ‘Is this another abortion location under the auspices of a contraceptive clinic?’”

Additionally, Dayton Right to Life is concerned about the young women in this community who will avoid seeking proper healthcare for convenience or modesty's sake. “Because of the high incidence of sexually transmitted diseases and other risk factors among teens, businesses like these are simply irresponsible and make for bad healthcare,” adds Margie Christie, Assistant Executive Director.
