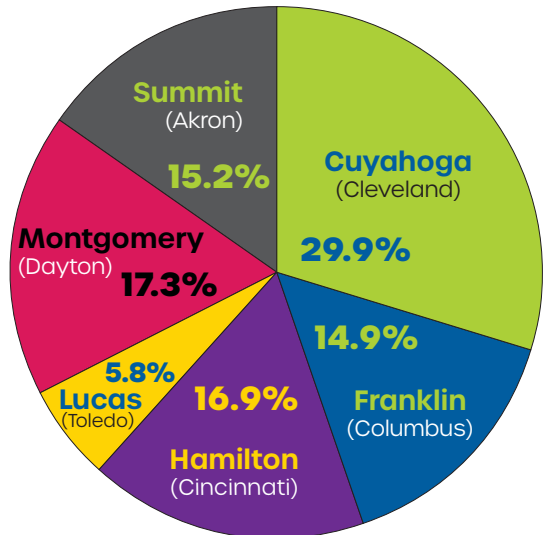

Statewide Characteristics of Ohio Women Who Have Abortions

- **93%** are *residents* of *Ohio*
- **81.5%** of *women* identify as *single, divorced, or widowed*
- **43%** identify as *white*
- **48%** identify as *black*
- **62%** have *other children*

FACT *(Statewide)*

The overall abortion numbers were lower due to the Heartbeat Law that was in place for 6 weeks.

Induced abortion statistics have been prepared in Ohio since 1976. The 2022 Annual Abortion Report presents information derived from both the “Confidential Abortion Reports” and “Post-Abortion Care Reports for Complications” in Ohio; reporting forms are included as Appendices I and II. Readers should note that abortion statistics in this report are limited to terminations occurring in Ohio; they do not include Ohio residents who obtained abortions outside the state.
